## SCIENCE ON YOUR EARS

Guidelines for creating a summary for SOYE.

The aim of the summary is to provide a brief overview of the motivation, methods used, and achieved results that can be understood not only by scientists in the same field but also by other interested individuals. The summary will be provided on the platform "SOYE - Science on your ears" as an audio summary. Therefore, the text will be automatically converted into an audio file. The length of the summary should be between 500 and 800 words and can be written in English. To simplify the narration, please spell out units (e.g., 5 km/h -> five kilometers per hour) and avoid using abbreviations with periods (e.g., approx. -> approximately). This can cause issues with automated voices, affecting the listening experience. For numbers, please use the notation 1,000.00 to avoid confusion.

Begin by briefly describing the problem statement and motivation for the addressed issue in a few sentences. Then outline the approach, making the methods and experimental procedure clear. However, please refrain from going into too much detail. The goal is to enable colleagues to determine if the methods used align with their own. Parameters and formulas should be referenced in the original article if relevant. The focus of the summary should be on the achieved results and the derived conclusions and recommendations. Present these in an understandable manner, making them accessible to a broad and interested audience. Therefore, try to use technical terms sparingly or explain them in a subordinate clause when necessary. In general, the text can be seen as a combination of an introduction and a summary, as these sections typically do not require graphics. You can use these two sections as a basis, and usually, you will only need to explain the methods in more detail. Please omit reference citations that are not necessary for understanding in the summary. Send us the necessary information about the used sources separately, so that we can add them to the information about your contribution. (In the text: "Germany has 80 million inhabitants." No reference required. "According to Kant, an action is morally right when..." Reference required, but without exact source)

In addition to the text, the following information is required:

- Title of the contribution
- Authors and affiliated organization
- Details of the original source with a link to the publication (DOI if available)
- Acknowledgment with information on the authors' funding
- Sources mentioned in the summary
